FACILITIES TASK FORCE UPDATE:

CHURCH

As for the new addition, all of the outside paving has been completed. The interior drywall has been hung and finished. The painters are starting to paint the interior of the addition. Once that is complete the trim will go up, then the flooring and doors. The electricians will soon hang the lights and install plugs and switches. Work will be discontinued from May 1 to May 15 to allow the voicers to finish their work on the organ. The building must be unoccupied for their work. In the sanctuary, the painter is scheduled to complete the bulk of his work before May 1 but will have some final touch ups after new lighting for the vestibule arrives. The new led lighting conversion and dimmer system in the sanctuary has been installed. As soon as the organ work is done, scaffolding will be removed and the remainder of the pews reinstalled. As addressed at the last voters meeting, we have a new roof leak in the sanctuary. Water is coming in around the large vents in the top of the roof. A roofer is scheduled to do the repair work after May 15, but before June 1. Once this work is done, pews will be removed again, scaffolding will be set up, and the ceiling will be touched up that has been water stained from the new leak. Landscaping and furniture is currently being determined. Landscaping will be installed for our grand opening. The grand opening date will be announced in the next few weeks.

<u>SCHOOL</u>

The outside brick work is fully underway. The masons are sealing around the windows with new caulk. Over the summer all of the bathrooms will be remodeled. This work should start May 29. Bids are being gathered for flooring in the halls and classrooms. Work on waterproofing the foundation in the school and in the brick garden area will begin soon. Materials have been received for new stair treads similar to the Gym entrance. A bid has been received for painting the stairways. This work is scheduled to be complete for the beginning of the upcoming school year.

NATIONAL LUTHERAN SCHOOL ACCREDITATION:

Congratulations to Trinity Lutheran School! After many months of preparation, the National Lutheran School Association (NLSA) Validation Team has recommended that Trinity Lutheran School continue to be accredited, pending further review by the District Commission and final action in July by the National Accreditation Commission. NLSA accreditation is a process that includes improving educational quality, making necessary changes, providing for staff development, and making a difference in the lives of students and families. NLSA accreditation is based on a five-year cycle. Each school accredited by NLSA must meet the following standards:

- The school is mission-driven
- The school demonstrates its Christian mission through relationships with congregations, community, staff, students and families.
- The school is governed and administered according to written policy.
- A qualified and competent staff serves the school.
- The school has written curriculum that integrates the Christian faith and is supported by appropriate materials and resources.
- Christian teachers facilitate student learning to achieve the planned outcomes of the school's curriculum.
- The school plans for and provides resources and activities for students beyond the standard classroom instruction.
- The school maintains a safe and healthy learning environment.
- All buildings, grounds, and equipment support student learning and conform fully with applicable laws and building codes.
- The school has a financial plan to accomplish its mission.
- Evaluation tools and processes are used to define success and plan for continued school improvement.

In addition to meeting each of the standards listed above, the NLSA Validation Team identified 10 particular strengths of Trinity Lutheran School:

- The Mission Statement is Biblically based and wellcommunicated.
- 2. Trinity staff has developed an educational environment that encourages academic and spiritual growth for students, as well as a supportive ministry environment.
- 3. Trinity has benefitted from the leadership provided by the administrators, pastors and school board members.
- 4. The school has a very strong presence in the community, working with the congregation in several activities throughout the year.
- 5. The Elements of Success program has created a positive culture throughout the school.
- 6. Trinity has a current and up-to-date BCDS manual with clear responsibilities and functions expressed.
- 7. All full-time teaching staff (K-8) are on the LCMS Roster or eligible to be rostered.
- 8. There is a well-developed curriculum review schedule in place and effectively implemented.
- 9. Part-time resource teacher, teacher trained volunteers, and Lutheran Child and Family Services are available as needed.
- 10. The student Safety Patrol trains students in responsibility, safety, and service.

Thank you to the staff, faculty, and congregation members who put in many hours of groundwork in preparation for this visit. We are very blessed to have you all!
