Sixth Sunday after the Epiphany

- Fact: Jesus bodily and historically died on a cross.
- Fact: Even though Jesus did factually die, Jesus was bodily and historically resurrected from death the tomb is empty.
- Fact: This all actually and factually happened within history for you.
 - If these events didn't actually take place within our time and space, everything you trust concerning Jesus and everything you believe concerning Jesus is in vain.
 - In fact, you are already dead if Jesus wasn't resurrected.
- But, you do not believe in vain, because Jesus actually died and rose from the dead in the flesh.
 - With Jesus Death on the Cross, you are forgiven.
 - With Jesus being resurrected from the dead, you are righteous.
- You are actually given forgiveness, life, and salvation because of what Christ actually, and really did *for you*.
- Fact: You are forgiven all of your sins.
- Fact: You are declared righteous, therefore, you have already been given eternal life as God's baptized child.
- Fact: Because of what Jesus does *for you* and *gives to you*, you will be resurrected on the last day; all things, *including you*, will be brand new.

Our Practice in Participating in the Lord's Supper


