STRATEGIC SPOTLIGHT

In 2016, Trinity Lutheran Church and School adopted a Strategic Plan to guide its efforts and bring about improvements across all areas of ministry. A vision statement was written to summarize the goals of the plan and provide direction for our efforts. Trinity's vision statement is: We aspire to be an inviting, thriving congregation of spiritually-mature, actively-involved members who positively impact our community.

An Inviting and Thriving Congregation - Improvements in the area of accessibility and other facility issues were identified as needed in order for Trinity to be a truly inviting and thriving congregation. In addition to the renovation and expansion project at the downtown church, an estimated \$1.2 million in improvements were identified at the school facility. Over the past year, following projects have been completed:

- Boiler system replacement
- Roof repairs
- Outdoor brickwork and window sealing
- Bathroom remodeling
- New flooring in the halls and classrooms
- New treads, carpet and painting in the stairways
- Water remediation on the south wall of the brick garden
- Extended care room renovations
- New furniture in the 8th grade classroom

A great deal of effort has gone into work on these projects and we are so thankful to all who have contributed to make these improvements possible. To God be the Glory!
