THIS WEEK IN SUNDAY SCHOOL: The investigation for this week is "The Case of the Little Coat: Hannah's Prayer." God cares and provides for

This study will show us how to find Christ in dire situations many women find themselves in on a daily basis. In fact, we can win if we understand the root of the problem and what Christians have done from the beginning to beat them.
